“Who do You say I am?”

” It is always good to reflect on the question Jesus poses “Who do you say I am?”

The question “Who do you say that I am?” can help me grow in understanding of who I am called to be. The more I seek to know God more fully, the more I enter into deeper relationship, the more clearly, I know myself. The opposite is also true. The more I dig deep into who I am at my core, find my voice, the more fully I will know who and how God is. This is a “both/and” invitation.

In a way Peter's story is our story too. We are so much like him. We too blow hot and cold in our loyalty to Christ. Sometimes we are strong, and sometimes we are like a reed shaking in the wind. But we should not be afraid to look at ourselves to see if we are growing as Christians; to see if we are becoming more attached to Christ. Without a warm relationship with Christ, such as Peter had, we are only on the fringes of Christianity. We are like someone talking about love compared with someone who is in love. We can learn so much from Peter for our own relationship with Christ. ‘

Peter was the first pope. In assessing a pope, we should not so much look for cleverness, for there is enough cleverness in the world, but for goodness. But the one thing we must never do is take away the pope's humanity. We must not make a superman out of him, much less a God.
