The Feast of Corpus Christi

5th /6th June 2021

The Mass: Central to our lives and to our Sunday

Lord Jesus Christ, high priest of the new and eternal covenant, on the altar of the cross you offered a perfect sacrifice to the Father; - teach us how to offer it with you.

This Feast of Corpus Christi we can gather as a congregation in church, though with greatly restricted capacity. We cannot have traditional Corpus Christi Processions. We can give heartfelt thanks for the supreme gift of the Eucharist, the gift of Christ's sacrifice and presence. Be of good heart.

For so much of the past fifteen months our congregations have been "fasting from the Bread of Life". I appreciate how difficult many found it, also many felt it unfair. Being able to join in offering Mass via streaming and parish radio was a rich blessing, but it fell short of gathering in church.

I am conscious of the ongoing postponement of First Communion and Confirmations and the severe restrictions regarding funerals and weddings, - all sacraments so rich in meaning: Children meeting Jesus in the Bread of Life for the first time; older children receiving the life-long gift of the Holy Spirit. At a funeral, the altar symbolises eternal life, "dying Christ destroyed our death"; at a wedding, the altar symbolises faithful love, "the love of Christ even unto death".

With the enforced 'fasting' in all our lives, has our appreciation of the "Bread of Life" grown? In our hearts has the absence increased our appreciation and love of the Mass:

- as a gathering of people of faith
- as finding hope and light in the Word of God
- as the offering of Christ's sacrifice to the Father
- as receiving the 'Bread of Life', necessary food for life's journey
- as a great prayer of thanksgiving.

Returning to Mass – Covid19 Update

- There is no need to book a place to attend Mass in the parish.
- The dispensation from attending Mass on Sundays and Holydays of obligation remains in place until further notice. You are encouraged to attend Mass on any day during the week which fulfils your Sunday obligation.
- There will be a sign in sheet at each entrance door of the church. Please sign your name and telephone number for contact tracing purposes and sanitise pen after use. There will be ushers at the doors for any assistance required.
- Anniversary Masses: There will be a designated area in both churches for families attending an Anniversary Mass.
- Any person with an underlying medical condition or at a high risk of illness can continue participating in the Mass online at www.milltownlistryparish.com or by radio link 106fm.
- Receiving the Eucharist – the host may only be received in the hand. Please approach the Altar row by row, ensuring a safe distance from the person in front of you.
- Please ensure that you wear face coverings in the church and sanitise as you enter and leave the church.
- Once Mass is over, please exit the church row by row by the same door you came in. We ask, that you do not congregate on church grounds after Mass.
- The churches will be sanitised daily.
- Masses will continue online www.milltownlistryparish.com And on the radio, 106fm.
