

St. Colman's Parish First Sunday of Lent 5th /6th March 2022

What's all the fuss about? Why is everyone talking about Synodality and what is it exactly?

In short, Pope Francis has asked for the help of each and every member of the Church to help us grow in synodality. By synodality he means that to live as a Christian community we need to learn how to come together to listen to each other. By listening to each other we can better hear the guidance of the Holy Spirit helping us to carry out the mission that Jesus has given to each of us and to the Church as a whole. Pope Francis asks us to discuss our joys and struggles as followers of the Lord, confident that as we discuss these things the Holy Spirit will help us to support each other better on our Christian journey.

The word Synodality itself comes from Ancient Greek and refers to us - all being together - syn - on the same path - hodus. We are all on the same path together, and it is the Holy Spirit who keeps us together on that path.

The Pope has asked for something extraordinary - every diocese and every local Bishop has been asked to gather the people together to pray, to discuss, to reflect and to listen so that we can learn from each other locally and so that the Bishops of the world can pass on what they have heard to Pope Francis at a meeting in Rome in October 2023.

To this end, our own Pastoral Area will be holding a listening meeting where everyone is welcome to pray, reflect and discuss how we journey along the road together as followers of Jesus Christ, how we can reach out to others and how we can support each other better...... continued back page
