Caesar and God:

In his inaugural address on January 20, 1961, John F. Kennedy, the newly elected President of the United States, gave the famous challenge: "My fellow Americans, ask not what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country. My fellow citizens of the world ask not what America will do for you, but what together we can do for the freedom of man. Finally, whether you are citizens of America or citizens of the world, ask of us here the same high standards of strength and sacrifice which we ask of you. With a good conscience our only sure reward, with history the final judge of our deeds, let us go forth to lead the land we love, asking God's blessing and His help, but knowing that here on earth God's work must truly be our own." — If we personalised Kennedy's statement it would read, "Don't ask, 'What can my country do for me?' Instead ask, 'What can I do for my country?" And add, "Don't ask, 'What can God do for me?' Instead ask, 'What can I do for God?'" Today's Gospel lesson gives the correct answer.

We need to check our heart's investments: When Jesus says, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's," the command really asks us whether we have invested our heart in the right place, in something worthy of our life's blood, something that will yield a return that's worthy of a whole human life. There is only one way to find out where our hearts are. Let us check our daily choices, the little ones as well as the big ones, and look for the patterns: What do we usually do when decision time comes for where we will spend our prime time and our best energies? These are the infallible indicators of what we truly value, and what we don't. Whose image do others see when they look at our life? When people see us, do they see Jesus engraved upon us? To the extent that they do, we are making visible the extent to which we belong to the Kingdom of God.
