

St. Colman's Parish 2nd Sunday of Advent 9th /10th December 2023

A Tale of Repentance.

Not too many years ago, newspapers carried the story of Al Johnson, a Kansas man who repented of his sins and chose Jesus Christ as his Lord and Saviour. What made his story so remarkable was the fact that, as a result of his newfound Faith in Christ, he confessed to a bank robbery he had participated in when he was nineteen years old. Because of the statute of limitations, Johnson could not be prosecuted for the offence. But because of his complete and total change of heart, he not only confessed his crime but voluntarily repaid his share of the stolen money! — That's repentance — *metanoia* — the radical change of heart demanded by John the Baptist in this Sunday's Gospel.

John's message calls us to confront and confess our sins; to turn away from them in sincere repentance; to receive God's forgiveness; and most importantly, to look to Jesus. Do we need to receive God's forgiveness? There are basically three reasons why we fail to receive forgiveness. Firstly, we fail to recognise as sin what we have done or failed to do; secondly, we recognise the sin but do not repent of it, and thirdly is that we ourselves fail to forgive those who have injured us.

We need to make use of this Advent as a season of reflection and preparation. We are invited by the Church to prepare for Christmas through this time of reflection and personal renewal in preparation for the coming of Jesus into our lives. In the section of St. Peter's Second Letter which we read in this week's scripture readings, Peter reminds us, on the one hand of God's great desire to come into our lives and, on the other, of our need to be prepared for that event when it happens. We want, and need, God's help and comfort, but we are not always prepared to change our ways to enhance genuine conversion. For God to come to us, we also need to go to Him. We need to let every day become Christmas and the "Day of the Lord" for each one of us.
